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Hi Janice -

At the meeting of the Concord Energy and Environment Committee (CEEC) on March 6th, legislation that supports the City of Concord's energy goals were discussed. CEEC asks the city council and city administration to consider supporting bills on municipal aggregation and an increase in the net metering cap. To that end, I am writing to ask to for the addition of a suspense item to the March 11th city council meeting to discuss and consider these important legislative proposals. Councilor Kenison also supports the addition of of a suspense item to consider these proposals.

Info on the specific bills is attached. The municipal aggregation bill (SB 286) has been approved by the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee and will be considered on the Senate Floor this Thursday, March 14th. City of Concord Planning staff are supportive of this policy approach as it will benefit the city and support the city's goals.

I've also attached a letter in support of SB 286 that has been signed by the town of Hanover and the City of Nashua that provides additional information on municipal aggregation.
