### **Background**

1. Funds are requested to be expended under the authority established pursuant to Resolution #8120, adopted December 10, 2007.
2. The purpose of these funds as stated above is a condition of a Merrimack County Superior Court plea disposition and is consistent with and presents no conflict or obstacle to the accomplishment of City Council goals, the code of ordinances, or the operating functions of the department.
4. No City match is required.
5. Funds have already been received by the City and are currently held at the Concord Police Department.

### **Discussion**

On 05/03/2016 the Merrimack County Superior Court issued a disposition in docket #217-2016-CR-0081 (Charge ID # - 1183230C) – Defendant: Amanda Parent. The charges associated with this docket number involved the possession of illegal drugs with intent to distribute. The disposition of this case is a plea agreement which stipulates that the amount of \$6,782.00 be voluntarily forfeited to the Concord Police Department – Drug Enforcement Unit. These funds are currently being held at the Concord Police Department and were seized as part of the investigation in this case. It is requested that the City Council accept and appropriate these funds to be utilized by the Concord Police Department Drug Enforcement Unit in furtherance of drug investigations within the City.
