## RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR REBUILDING AMERICAN INFRASTRUCTURE WITH SUSTAINABILITY AND EQUITY (RAISE) FUNDING FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DESIGNING AND CONSTRUCTING A PORTION OF THE MERRIMACK RIVER GREENWAY TRAIL (CIP #543)

## The City of Concord resolves as follows:

- WHEREAS, the City, with assistance from the Friends of the Merrimack River Greenway Trail, desires to apply for "Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity" (RAISE) funding to support the design and construction of segments of CIP #543 Merrimack River Greenway Trail; and,
- WHEREAS, the focus of the RAISE program is to fund planning or construction of surface transportation infrastructure projects that will improve safety; environmental sustainability; quality of life; mobility and community connectivity; economic competitiveness and opportunity including tourism; state of good repair; partnership and collaboration; and innovation; and,
- **WHEREAS,** program funding is comprised of 100% federal funds with no local match required; and,
- WHEREAS, the community desires to create a continuous 12.7-mile trail through the City, connecting to regional trails extending from Salem, NH northerly to Lebanon, NH, and additional funding is critical to connecting the segments already constructed and/or funded.

## **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Concord that:

- 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to apply for a RAISE Grant through the U.S. Department of Transportation for construction of portions of the Merrimack River Greenway Trail.
- 2. This resolution shall take effect upon passage.
