SUBJECT: Municipal Airport Deauthorization Resolution – Stormwater

Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) Update

Recommendation

Rescind and deauthorize the sum of \$8,500 dollars in Grants and Donation funds of which 90% is Federal (\$7,650), 5% State (\$425) and 5% City (\$425) for the purposes of updating the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP).

Background

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) signed and issued the 2021 National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Multi-Sector General Permit (MSGP) for industrial stormwater discharges on January 15, 2021. The 2021 MSGP became effective on March 1, 2021 and replaced the 2015 MSGP. This permit requires the update of the facilities SWPPP; and, a Notice of Intent for coverage under this permit was required to be filed with EPA by June 1, 2021. The airport is a facility that is regulated by this permit for stormwater discharge.

In April 2021, City Council authorized the City Manager to apply for a grant to update the SWPPP to comply with this new permit regulation.

In May 2022, the City Council authorized funds in the amount of \$8,500 for this purpose and project funding was to be allocated as follows: \$7,650 (90%) Federal share, \$425 (5%) State share, and \$425 (5%) City share.

Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) informed the City of Concord in late fall 2022 that their Airport Improvement Grant Program would no longer fund updates to Airports SWPPP.

Discussion

Funding in the amount of \$8,500 for the purpose of updating the current SWPPP has been budgeted and approved in the FY25 Airport Operating budget. The project is anticipated to begin in the fall 2024 with a completion date targeted for the end of 2024.
