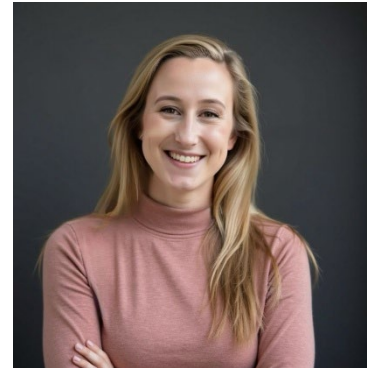

The Planning Division also provides staff support to several committees including the Conservation Commission, Heritage Commission and Architectural Design Review Committee.
