Good morning Councilor Davie,

I have lived at 7 Washington Street for 33 years. During that time, the City has plowed the sidewalk on this block only twice. I have been told the sidewalk is too narrow for the city's sidewalk plows due to the 3-hour parking restriction signs mounted at the curb-line.

However, over-limit parking is rarely enforced, making the signs not merely unnecessary, but problematic.

On Friday, during snow removal, a City equipment operator knocked down one of the two 3-hour parking signs. A cone was placed temporarily, leaving only one remaining sign designating the restriction.

Rather than reinstalling the sign, I recommend that the City remove the 3-hour parking restriction entirely, remove the remaining sign, and add this block of Washington Street to the regular sidewalk-plowing schedule.

I would be happy to attend a Parking Committee meeting to testify in support of an ordinance change. Thank you for addressing this longstanding and irritating

issue.
