Nice to see you yesterday.

Thank you for speaking with us again about the date for Halloween for Penacook.

With regard to the report of the previous police chief, he states what history we already know. But he does not include the fact that the Halloween Parade, the movie night nor the supposed combined celebration with Boscawen happen anymore and, in fact, have not happened in decades. The reasons for the early celebration are gone yet we are saddled with a meaningless tradition. It is time for change.
