Our crews waded through chest deep water and pulled the victims to safety in a boat on two consecutive days.

I'm not sure if you guys were the firefighters who rescued us at the Healy park homeless encampment yesterday but I wanted to thank you guys so much personally for saving our lives and being so supportive, compassionate, kind and gentle during the whole rescue and give an extra big shoutout to the firefighter who carried me on his back to the boat due to my boots being frozen all week, he was amazing and super gentle and normally I'm petrified of being picked up by anybody for even 2 seconds but on his back I felt safe and secure! Thank you again!! And thank you for saving more people there today!!! Yesterday morning I woke up and felt death in the air and was so so scared I was going to die by my worst fear of a way to die, drowning/ hypothermia and I'm glad I didn't have to have that fate!! I hope nobody who was/is in the camp is still stuck and I hope everyone made it out alive!!! But you guys are AWESOME!!!! Once I'm in a better place regarding finances and housing I'll definitely support you guys in any way I can but for now I'll support you guys by praising yall to anybody who'll listen @@

Hi everyone,

I hope you are all doing well.

Tom: I want to send a quick "thank you" and praise to all of your teams for assisting me-us with (another) crash and clogged drain up here on Little Pond Road this afternoon.

Around noon today, a driver, clearly going way too fast, crashed into our row of mailboxes (yes, there is a story on Patch about it now; couldn't resist). I know he was traveling too fast because the granite pillars the mailboxes were on cracked in multiple pieces and some of those pieces were thrown more than six feet from the crash scene (he has priors, too; says he will be back tomorrow to start fixing it ...).

I called police and dispatch sent officers and fire and rescue teams, who arrived in minutes, despite it being an insanely busy day due to the storm. While outside, pouring buckets, I saw that the storm drain was stopped up again, and I couldn't find the general services number on my phone. So, I called Sue at your office, and requested her to call CGSD.

I'm so sorry to have bugged her, but please thank her for assisting me.

Officer Audet was awesome through the entire experience and officers were here, directing traffic, through the area, since we were down to a single lane.

CGSD came later, unclogged the storm drain, and picked up the broken street sign, too.

I don't know what more we can do to get drivers, especially those traveling east, to slow the eff' down. This is the fifth time, in 21 years, our mailboxes have been knocked out with multiple crashes, too, into them without knocking them out. Since my family has owned this house, it has happened about seven times now. Also, a driver crashed into our driveway, driving into the back end of a rental car I had in the 1990s. I don't think putting another 20-mph sign will make any difference. Maybe I'll get a custom-made "SLOW THE EFF DOWN YOU IDIOTS!" Sign. j/k.

I'll close by saying, thank you, again, for all of your team's help today. I know how crazy things are in our city right now. But I'm so grateful to all of you and the leadership you provide that clearly trickles down to your teams during an emergency.
