Good afternoon, Byron.

I am not in favor of a citywide masking mandate for the following reasons:

- It would be best for officialdom, local and remote, to begin treating the citizenry as adults concerning things Covidic. People inclined to wear masks already do. Those who aren't or, like most of us, do so in some places but not others, will resent the intrusion and evade the ordinance whenever possible, generating ill-will and little marginal benefit. Masking should be a choice because the risks to the masker and others vary greatly depending on the company, the physical circumstances, and the choices that people have made about vaccination. No central authority, even one as wise and virtuous as the City Council, is in as good a position to assess those risks as is the individual who will live with the consequences. There are clear downsides to masks, not just because they are obnoxious to wear, but also because they interfere with human interaction in a way that approaches the anti-social. Some will make foolish choices; others will be injured through no fault of their own. As pandemic progresses to endemic, this will be true, masks notwithstanding. Infantilization of the populace because danger is present is a poor way to govern a free society.
- In practice, enforcement is a problem. I very much dislike the idea of the police or other
 public officials issuing summons for improper face wear and I doubt that they would want
 to do it. Unenforceable rules tend to induce contempt for rules in general, which is not
 socially constructive and not what I recommend in bullet 1 (but this this a topic for
 another time).

- Local merchants and other business owners are already able to ask that their customers
 wear masks, and some do. My agent at the League of NH Craftsmen Store tells me that
 a very small minority of customers storm out in a snit when asked to mask, but that
 almost everybody complies with a personal request to don the doily. I attribute that to
 elementary courtesy toward the person in front of you, which is far more powerful and
 socially constructive than directives from above.
- The Council could certainly publicly endorse masking without adding the element of coercion.

If the CC decides to skate by my sage advice and pass an ordinance anyway, I suggest that it sunset at a date certain <u>or</u> when the number of Covid cases in Concord Hospital drops to a manageable level. My reason for suggesting both standards is that, if the mandate has not had a discernable effect by a certain time, then it should be re-justified or dropped.

Since I waded into the discussion this far, let me follow up with Part 2. I agree with you that any mandate must have a termination point based on a measurable checkpoint. However, the challenge is to decide what to use as that metric. I think that there are four choices--new cases, open cases, hospitalizations and deaths--but each of them has limitations. Let's look.

New Cases--Currently, new cases are fairly accurately reported because testing is done at a controlled group of testing sites that can easily report and the data can be easily consolidated. Additionally, under the current testing requirements, we are likely seeing at least marginally more positive cases as a result of increased testing. But are the cases asymptomatic, mild or severe? Are they likely to end in hospitalizations? Use of the "positivity rate" will be impacted by the number of tests performed. Moreover, as home testing becomes more prevalent, the reporting of new cases will be flawed and under-reported, since a person with no, or mild symptoms, is not required, nor likely, to report that case. As reported cases decrease, it does not necessarily mean that the actual number of cases has decreased. If all cases are asymptomatic or mild, is a mask mandate unnecessarily too restrictive?

Daily Cases--Same issues as the reporting for new cases. Plus, how are "cured" cases determined? Are the cases asymptomatic, mild or severe? Should we be viewing all positive cases the same?

Hospitalizations--This is perhaps the most useful metric, as pressure on hospital resources can be a serious problem, but it still is not all that useful in determining when to lift a mask mandate. As a lagging indicator, at what level is the target set? If the vast majority of hospitalizations are of the unvaccinated, will mandatory mask use by the vaccinated make a significant difference to those who choose to remain

unvaccinated and, likey, unmasked? Can mandated mask use have a meaningful impact on hospitalizations?

Deaths--At the risk of sounding cold and uncaring, this may be the least useful indicator. There are too many variables between the imposition of a mask mandate and the other risk factors associated with a reported death to draw meaningful conclusions.

I think that the challenge for you and your fellow counselors is to determine your goal for the mask mandate. What do you realistically hope to achieve? Can all of the variables be measured, controlled and enforced to reach the desired outcome through this one action? If not, then the imposition of a mandate will be ineffective at best and, since every action has an equal and opposite reaction, may lead to undermining of trust at worst.

Two last thoughts. For nearly two years, we have tried shutdowns, travel bans, mask mandates, vaccination, boosters, virtual meetings, testing, etc. Europe has gone through several iterations of shutdowns. Yet, we still haven't beaten the virus into submission. I know that it is tempting to do something--anything--but is the outcome worth the cost?

Second, there is some good news. Omicron seems to be fading in Africa. They are a few weeks ahead of us. Perhaps we will see a reduction in our cases soon as well.

So, that is what I'm thinking about with the little I know and unchallenged by debate, and it makes me glad that I do not have to vote on this issue. I certainly have more questions than answers. Given all of that, my coin flip comes up as against a mandate seven out of ten times rather than the three out of five times that I shared earlier.



NOTICE FOR MANDATING COVID-19 MASKS

January 4, 2022

This serves as notice that the mandate for any individual to wear a mask against COVID-19 violates federal law. All <u>COVID-19 masks</u>, whether surgical, N95 or other respirators, are authorized, not approved or licensed, by the federal government; they are <u>Emergency Use Authorization</u> (EUA) only. They merely "may be effective." Federal law states:

Title 21 U.S.C. § 360bbb-3(e)(1)(A)(ii)(I-III) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (FD&C Act) states:

individuals to whom the product is administered are informed—

- (I) that the Secretary has authorized the emergency use of the product;
- (II) of the significant known and potential benefits and risks of such use, and of the extent to which such benefits and risks are unknown; and
- (III) of the option to accept or refuse administration of the product, of the consequences, if any, of refusing administration of the product, and of the alternatives to the product that are available and of their benefits and risks.

EUA products are by definition experimental and thus require the right to refuse. Under the Nuremberg Code, the foundation of ethical medicine, no one may be coerced to participate in a medical experiment. Consent of the individual is "absolutely essential." A federal court held that even the U.S. military could not mandate EUA vaccines to soldiers. Doe #1 v. Rumsfeld, 297 F.Supp.2d 119 (2003).

In a <u>letter</u> dated April 4, 2020, the Food and Drug Administration stated that authorized face masks must be labelled accurately and may not be labeled in a way that misrepresents the product's intended use as "source control to help prevent the spread of SARS-CoV-2." The letter specifies that the labeling "may not state or imply that the product is intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection or related uses or is for use such as infection prevention or reduction." Any EUA mandate requiring individuals to wear face masks conflicts with Section 360bbb-3(e)(1)(A)(ii)(I-III), which provides that the person must be informed of the option to refuse to wear the device.

Liability for forced participation in a medical experiment, including possible injury, may be incalculable. You MUST respect and uphold the rights of individuals to refuse to wear EUA masks.

In conclusion, as stated, YOU have NO RIGHT(S) to require residents or visitors in Concord to wear a mask as a condition of patronage . YOU ARE BREAKING THE LAW !!!

Dear Mayor Bouley and members of City Council,

I write to you today in support of the prudent mask mandate I hope you will craft and implement as soon as possible.

With cases surging and variants more contagious than ever, mask wearing is a simple and essential technique to keep bad outcomes to a minimum while we continue to encourage vaccinations. The science is clear and should be uncontroversial.

I strongly support the reimplementation of a mask ordinance in Concord. I am the mother of two young children and my youngest is not yet eligible to be vaccinated due
