RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF FORTY-NINE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$49,000) FOR THE ACQUISITION OF CONSERVATION LAND AS RECOMMENDED BY THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION, AUTHORIZING THE USE OF FORTY-NINE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$49,000) IN CONSERVATION TRUST FUNDS FOR THIS PURPOSE, AND AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF LAND SOUTH OF AND ADJACENT TO THE DISCONTINUED PORTION OF DISTRICT NO. 5

The City of Concord resolves as follows;

WHEREAS, on April 12, 2004 the City adopted the provisions of RSA 36-A, re-establishing the Concord Conservation Commission with the power to acquire in the name of the city, subject to the approval of the local governing body, by gift, purchase, grant, bequest, devise, lease, or otherwise, the fee in such land or water rights, or any lesser interest, development right, easement, covenant, or other contractual right including conveyances with conditions, limitations or reversions, as may be necessary to acquire, maintain, improve, protect, or limit the future use of or otherwise conserve and properly utilize open spaces and other land and water areas within the city; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) included a recommendation to purchase land or easements for the purposes as provided in RSA 36-A noted as CIP # 352; and

WHEREAS, is located within the Conservation Focus Area identified as “Beech Hill” in the 2017 Conservation Open Space Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Conservation Commission, under the provision of RSA 36-A, conducted a public hearing on November 10, 2020, after which the Conservation Commission members voted unanimously in the affirmative to exercise their authority with regard to obtaining the parcel legally described as: Tax Map 69Z Lot 1, consisting of approximately 35 acres; and

WHEREAS, the family requests that the parcel be named in honor of their father Edward C. Leadbeater; and

WHEREAS, the Conservation Commission intends to pay for the above-cited parcel from the current funds available to the Conservation Commission in the Conservation Fund; and

WHEREAS, this appropriation is for a purpose not included in the Fiscal Year 2021 adopted budget; therefore Section 37 of the City Charter requires a two-thirds vote of the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Concord that:

- 1.) The City Manager be authorized to execute the Warranty Deed acquiring the parcel as described above, at a cost to the City not to exceed \$49,900 is hereby approved.
