> and I am a student at UNH Law, serving on the Diversity Coalition (DivCo) board. I have included my fellow board member, Uthej Kunamneni, and our President, Lexi Turner, in this correspondence.

> We would like to address a pressing need for additional accessible parking at UNH Law. Currently, the designated parking lot accommodates only four vehicles, with two additional accessible spots located outside this area. Given the growing demand, we believe that adding at least two more accessible parking spaces is essential for our students and faculty.

> This year, our 1L class has increased by ten students, bringing the total to 150, while the 2L class comprises approximately 140 students. This consistent annual growth underscores the necessity for enhanced accessible resources. Although UNH Law owns the parking lot and the existing accessible spaces, the street parking on White and Washington Streets falls under the jurisdiction of the City of Concord. Both streets provide access to entrances of the school, with parking available in front of these entrances.

DivCo respectfully requests that the city consider the creation of two or more accessible parking spots on Washington and White Streets, specifically near the three main entrances to the school. This addition is vital to support our community's needs, and the administration has expressed its concern regarding the current limitations.
