

Dear Mayor and Council Members,

It was just brought to my attention that parking restrictions on School Street between Pine and Liberty is back on the Agenda this evening. Unfortunately, I am unable to attend the meeting, so I would like to clarify my position as a resident and owner of the home located at 98 School Street via email. It was suggested at a prior meeting that I felt it was a mistake to have gone from 2 hour parking to unrestricted parking. This is not correct, I have no issues with the current unlimited parking ordinance from Pine to Liberty Street. I've had no issues with students parking near or in front of our home. We often have the need for on street parking and will move our cars to the street before students arrive. The recommendation from the parking committee was the result of a compromise between myself and our neighbor, who is not in favor of the current parking ordinance. To alleviate the concerns of our neighbor, I would support restricted parking during school hours on one side of the road when school is in session from September through June. Perhaps the parking could be limited on one side from Pine to Holt Street. This would allow some parking near or in front of our home. Both my wife and I work from home, have two older children that still reside at home and three others that visit often. Our adjoining tenants also often work from home and have an adult child living with them, so we often have the need for additional parking.
