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Hello,

I am writing you today to please ask you to vote "no" on indoor mask mandates for Concord. While new variants are obviously anxiety-inducing, Omicron is proving to be little more than a common cold. This tracks as far as viruses typically mutate to become less lethal but more contagious so the virus itself can survive.

The other specific items I would like to reference in support of NO mandates are the following:

1. A recent study in Bangladesh claims that masks help reduce spread but admit that cloth masks only reduced spread by 5% and surgical masks by 11%. That's not enough to force everyone to wear them regardless of age, health, etc.
2. Dr. Dan Stock spoke a few months ago on the topic saying that respiratory virus particles are too small for any masks to be able to accurately stop. The NIH also has come to the same finding in a few of their research studies as well.
3. Several people have taken videos holding a CO2 reader into their masks and are at roughly 3x the "safe" limit within minutes. This should NOT be something children have to deal with on a daily basis.
4. Masks can cause harm in children, the younger, the worse it can be. With a 0.003% chance of getting seriously ill or dying with the original strain (which seems to be nearly extinct now as Omicron is taking over), it simply doesn't make sense to risk their health - <https://www.perk-group.com/masks-harm-children>
5. See attached photo for pathogens found on masks (which can obviously also effect adults).
6. N95 masks have been found to be the least restrictive and most helpful but even they blow out all toxins which doesn't really help the non-spreading issue.
7. Fauci himself was found to early on be telling him cohorts that they do not work. Despite the rhetoric being passed around in the media, inhaling the moist, bacteria ridden air inside of your mask is not beneficial to our health. Especially if we are so worried about a respiratory illness. Check with nursing staff on how many cases of bacterial issues they've seen.

And lastly, mask mandates do not make any kind of logical sense when not held to a standard. Old Navy, Target, single layer, double layer, carbon inserts.... there's no consistency in terms of protection and we see masks discarded everywhere. Again, if this is all so terrible, shouldn't there be hazardous waste disposals for masks?

Please think carefully and do all due diligence researching before you vote to make mandates happen again. I truly believe it will only make Concord residents sicker & unhappier. Please vote to allow us to continue breathing freely. The choice is already there for anyone concerned to wear a mask in whatever setting they choose. The rest of us should also have a choice to do what we believe is healthier.

Please take the time to read the below. I understand some councilors will scoff at the sentiments written below, but perhaps, this is a chance to acquaint yourselves with what many people are thinking and feeling. Sometimes we become so caught up in our own social circles, that we end up failing to be exposed to an alternative point of view. I look forward to any responses. Thank you!

I write to oppose the idea of a mask mandate in our community. It is time to move past the idea that controlling other people's breath will save us. There is this incredible notion that those who are in elected positions know better than their constituents and that because of this, there is some duty to implement laws regarding an action that anyone could be doing at any time (but most people wilfully choose not to). Or, that by finding 25 people who can send emails in support of your idea, that that would be enough to put forward a law that affects over 40,000 people. Every single person who wrote those emails to Councilor Hawkins is capable enough of doing whatever they want in public (masked or unmasked), and shame on anyone who believes that they are superior because they do wear a mask. **Shame on anyone who tries to put down another person for not wearing a mask. Facemasks Are Not a Mere "Inconvenience"

One of the most trenchant arguments made by proponents of forced masking is some variation of “it’s just an inconvenience”, so/and/or “why do you have to make such a big deal about it”. (To be clear, this is not a legitimate scientific or factual argument for the adoption of any policy, but that is not what this article is about.) I am largely going to avoid the issues unique to masking children – what is plainly institutionalized child abuse – and for people with disabilities or past trauma, as many of the harms inflicted by masks are readily apparent and easily articulable.

On the surface, this contention seems like a morally and factually compelling argument. After all, if masks had any meaningful efficacy, wouldn’t it be a worthwhile tradeoff to endure a little discomfort to reduce the far worse suffering and death that would otherwise be inflicted by covid?

Yet this argument – “what’s the big deal” – does not square with how many people experience masks and mask mandates, including practically everyone who disagrees with masking as a policy. It is undeniable that millions of people are considerably more tormented by facemasks than what we would expect is reasonable or even possible for something that is

indeed merely an “inconvenience”. People generally do not profoundly suffer from trivialities.

In other words, clearly facemasks are a considerably greater burden for many people than how they superficially appear; and yet few people are able to work out for themselves what about them is so abusive or terrible. The goal of this article is to enumerate some of the myriad harms and emotional abuses inflicted by forced masking, specifically those that are difficult to articulate or identify the connection to masking.

So what exactly is the big deal about wearing masks?

In a nutshell – as was just stated – mask wearing is to many people something that is enormously stressful, and something that evokes inordinately powerful negative emotions. This is simply the reality, irrespective of whether such feelings “make sense”.

Now, as a general rule, if someone feels powerfully about something, there’s a reason; or in other words, there is something that is provoking the strong emotions. And the source of these feelings does not have to be the thing that the feelings attach to. The only thing that matters is that the feelings exist, however misguided they may be.

This is not to say that the reality of feelings should be the dominant consideration above everything else. The current radical ‘social justice’ movement that has elevated one’s subjective “identity” as the defining

characteristic of a person is the *Reductio ad Absurdum* of enshrining subjective feelings in place of objective reality itself.

What is true however is that the emotional distress and suffering of people is quite real. So even if you happen to be in favor of mask mandates and not at all bothered by mask wearing, that does not make the profoundly distressing experience of someone else any less real of an experience.

The following list is not exhaustive, just a collection of some of the factors that make mask wearing, especially forced masking, so distressing to many people.

A few important things to keep in mind:

1. Not every listed issue is true for every person who finds masks distressing.
2. Each issue amplifies the other ones, so that the cumulative distress is far greater than the sum of its parts. It's like the difference between $1+2+3+\dots+10$ and $1 \times 2 \times 3 \times \dots \times 10$ (55 vs 3,628,800).
3. This list is not exhaustive.
4. The short explanations are intended to give a bit more insight into how people might typically experience that particular stress. They are not intended to comprehensively define the issue.

Emotional Stresses of Mask Mandates

Deprivation of Personal Autonomy

Depriving someone of their personal autonomy is stressful and demeaning. This is amplified when it is about something that is emotionally fraught, subject to strong opinions and feelings, relates to morality/values, and/or is something that has an implication that you lack the capacity to look out for your own interest. Free will is a defining trait of being human, and the abrogation thereof is experienced as an assault on one's individuality.

A Sense of Helplessness

Being at the mercy of the arbitrary and capricious whims of others makes you feel a sense of helplessness, which is extremely stressful and grueling, and can eventually break a person mentally and emotionally, and is therefore a favored tactic used by tyrants to break the will of the population so that they are too broken to revolt (see Stalin's reign of terror).

Invalidating Your Personal Identity

Masking is now – regardless of the factual merits – a political symbol in society. Being forced to mask is by definition being forced to yield in one's own actions – and worse, in one's public appearance – to your ideological and/or political opposition. Imagine if the government decided to make wearing a religious skullcap mandatory for everyone – you can make the same argument that is being made for masking – what's the big deal, you

barely notice it, etc – I am quite confident that atheists for instance would feel very keenly the assault on their personal identity.

Assaulting Your Sense of Morality / Making You Feel Like You're Immoral and Selfish

Mask mandates force people opposed to internalize that they are acting immorally and selfishly for two reasons. The first is that society is enshrining into law that how you act is immoral and selfish, which is a public declaration to the world that you are immoral and selfish. The second is that how you act outwardly always exerts influence in how you feel and identify internally, so constantly wearing a mask eats away at your internal convictions – even if you can withstand this, it creates some degree of cognitive dissonance internally. No one likes to feel like they are evil or selfish.

Deprives / Ruins Human Interactions

The quality and nature of social interactions is greatly reduced. Every interaction behind masks is fundamentally different. Interacting in this way can feel sad, despondent, isolating, cold, and/or cruel, among other things.

Over Time Changes Your Personality

Facemasks are a radical and unnatural impingement on normal mental and emotional functioning. Over time, this can change your personality – such as making you less social, less outgoing, more suspicious, decreased tendency or desire to be kind and so on.

Turns Other People Into Abusive Tyrants

This is meant to capture the phenomenon of a subset of people who have turned into cruel and vicious individuals, and abuse people whom they have power over.

A General Feeling of Being Trapped in a Nightmare

Many people feel a clear and distinct sense of being trapped in some sort of perverse nightmare as a result of covid policies, which is an extremely distressing experience, especially when there feels like there is no end in sight.

Elementary Lack of Fairness

People are very sensitive to fairness, and can feel enormous stress and distress when treated unfairly, especially when the unfair treatment is egregious. Mask policies are literally imposing on some people so other people can feel safer – a grotesquely unequal treatment, that in order to help the emotional health of the scared-to-death-of-covid pro-maskers, everyone else's mental & emotional health will be trampled on by forced masking. Moreover, mask mandates preferentially enshrines the political, moral, and ideological views and sensibilities of one segment of society without any justification.

Repeated Experience of “Losing” in Public Policy Decisions

The experience of losing again, and again, and again in substantial, significant public policy decisions is itself very distressing. This happens

to be one of the more prominent animating forces that drove Trump's voter base – that they felt they always lost again and again and again and again. Covid policy for a substantial portion of the population has been a series of devastating losses as practically every policy choice cuts against them.

Feeling That Other People Matter While I Don't

This is a distinct distress in addition to the lack of fairness – that “I don't matter”; this is amplified considerably when “other people matter”. This is what people who are systematically disregarded tend to feel, and it is very painful.

And this is especially pronounced in racial minorities who already feel this way from previous history — mostly white liberal elites are forcing their preferences on blacks and other minorities.

The Stress of Difficulty Communicating

The frustration that comes from difficulty communicating is underappreciated, and tends to leave people feeling annoyed, frustrated and stressed.

The Damage From Failed Communication

This particular harm also has another, more tangible dimension – often, people having a hard time communicating simply give up, and giving up is itself an added stress factor that leaves people frazzled. If you're talking to your doctor and you “give up” instead of making sure you understood

what he was trying to tell you – especially older people who psychologically tend to both give up faster and have more innate difficulty physically hearing to begin with – that could be a big problem.

The Distress of Constant Harassment

Mask mandates are a constant intrusion into people's personal lives that leaves people feeling exasperated – “just leave me alone already” / “just let me live in peace”. It is a basic human need to not be constantly harassed by others.

Living In Constant State of Worry, Fear, and Anger

Knowing that you have to submit to the mask mandates in many places where you need to go leaves you always feeling a variety of negative and unhealthy emotions about it.

Saps the Joy From Many Different Activities

Take shopping, for instance. For many people, shopping is a leisure activity that can be an effective emotional detox from life stresses... but not when you have to wear a mask to do it.

Living In Perpetual Stress From Social Enforcers

Inevitably, people opposed to mask mandates will not be particularly zealous about following them to a “T”, whether it be letting the mask slide down your face, taking it off for a few minutes here and there, or just munching on a bag of peanuts for 3 hours. There is always a baseline

stress of constantly having to be alert for the “mask police” (whether they are actual police or just really annoying Karens).

Public Humiliation

The aforementioned “mask police” are often extremely zealous – unhinged, really – a non-masking-compliant person getting dressed down in public is a common occurrence. Public humiliation can be a traumatic experience.

Emotional Abuse

Mask mandates leave many people feeling emotionally abused. This is both from the masking being forced upon people despite all the mental and emotional distress it causes – in other words, abuse – and from the constant manipulation that is characteristic of abusers that is part and parcel of mask mandates.

Bullying Plain and Simple

Mask mandates are forced coercion jammed down the throats of those who strongly resent them. This is vicious bullying. No one enjoys feeling bullied, or having someone else’s will imposed on them against their own will.

The Distress of Being Under the Control of Someone You Loathe

Think of it this way: Imagine two ppl vying for the same promotion who hate each others guts, and then the winner is made the boss of the loser.

This is an added, separate affront to the loser. Same idea here – the anti-mask people are being specifically dictated to by the very opponents they despise, and on the very issue that they're fighting over. This isn't just at a national level – this is more true about local county or school board fights, and this is a reliable recipe for bad blood and lasting enmity to boot.

The "Tax" of Buying Masks that are Less Unpleasant

Many people choose to buy fancier masks than the nasty surgical masks widely available everywhere, because they are far less unpleasant (and far more sanitary and subject to manufacturing standards and quality control). This itself is a further indignity – if the government wants to impose a draconian mandate on us, the least the government can do is to make comfortable masks available, especially considering the government is throwing cash everywhere because of covid – it's an added insult and disrespecting of the people being imposed upon, in the sense that it's just plain coldhearted to act this way to someone else, at least have a little sensitivity and try to make your own mandates as tolerable as possible on the people you're imposing on.

Irrational Government Actions Breed A Sense of Fear and Instability

Watching the government act in such a factually irrational manner is itself very stressful to many people, as is living under an irrational regime. One's sense of stability and trust in the world is rooted by necessity in the belief that rationality is a limiting principle at some point upon what

government and people/institutions with power in society are able and willing to do.

Makes People Doubt Their Sense of Reality

The very fact of making a crazy policy is itself deeply destructive to people's sense of reality. In other words, there is tremendous cognitive dissonance of on the one hand knowing that masking is nuts, but on the other hand, watching the government make mask mandates – it is very hard to have a genuine emotional conviction that essentially the entire medical community and all of society's institutions have gone stark raving mad. Such cognitive dissonance is very damaging psychologically to your sense of self and your sense of reality, and is also mentally and emotionally exhausting.

Destroys People's Sense of Trust & Stability

Being forced to do irrational and insane things erodes a person's sense of confidence that there is a baseline rationality in society — something that provides people with a sense of stability and security in life generally. It is distressing to feel like there is absolutely no rational limiting principle on government actions or policies, since this by definition means that there is nothing that you can trust is sacred and beyond government (or someone else) coming and destroying. (This also actively erodes the social fabric that relies upon people being rational.)

Destructive of People's Humanity and Dignity

Being forced to act irrationally causes you to lose your sense of dignity as a human being with an intellectual faculty that distinguishes man from animals. In other words, the more you are suppressed from acting in accordance with intelligence, the less you feel the unique transcendence of being a human being – treating people like animals makes them feel like animals.

Dehumanization Through Forced Anonymity

The face is the most visibly manifest characteristic that sets you apart as a unique individual. Masks, by covering your face, strip you to some degree of your sense of being a unique individual and instead makes you feel more like a number than a person. It also distorts your sense of the humanity of others, as you inevitably become trained to perceive other people as lacking human-ness.

They're so Darn Uncomfortable

Masks can be extremely uncomfortable to wear, especially for long stretches at a time. They can also be quite gross to wear – if you sneeze into the mask, well.....

Pragmatic Harms of Mask Mandates

Promotes Authoritarianism and Fascism

This is true as written – the ascendance of authoritarian and tyrannical governance has been as shocking as it was swift. Mask mandates – which are objectively draconian and authoritarian regardless of whether they are

scientifically warranted – internalize in people that authoritarian governance is normal, acceptable, and not evil. This is a problem. Every genocidal regime started this way. This by itself is sufficient justification to fight mask mandates “to the death”.

On a more relatable level, mask mandates accustom government officials to acting like tyrants, and enjoying their newfound dictatorial powers, a ‘perk’ they are very unlikely to part with willingly.

Promotes Religious Cultism

Masks have become a religious symbol of virtuosity of a fanatical cult of irrational beliefs that has completely forsaken thinking for the cult members (like lone drivers wearing masks in their cars). Cults have committed some of the most horrific and bizarre atrocities over the past century.

Socially Conditions the Citizenry to Be Docile and Unthinking

Authoritarian mandates that are based only upon the word of people (the “experts”), especially in stark contradiction to facts and common sense, conditions people to be docile, and to not think about anything (as their intellects and opinions are scorned and said to be of too poor quality to be legitimate sources of knowledge for anyone, including themselves). This destroys the vibrancy and energy of the society, and conditions people to not think of themselves as individually capable beings who have the potential to achieve greatness, a critical driving force necessary to impel people to make something of themselves.

Balkanizes Society

Mask mandates help to further sow division and enmity between the factions of society by oppressing one faction while also giving the other faction the moral grounds to claim that the anti-mask faction by not going along with the mandate policies are in violation of the law, and are acting immorally as defined by societal approbation of mask mandates as a crucial health measure.

All-Encompassing Harms of Mask Mandates

Stress

The most obvious general harm of mask mandates is stress. Stress is known to be aggressively destructive to your health, and something that significantly exacerbates every known medical condition. Everything listed above causes the people afflicted to be stressed.

Breach of the Social Compact

When part of society is so wantonly destructive towards another part of society, the society loses its legitimacy in the eyes of the oppressed, and the rule of law is incorrigibly eroded, since one side simply inflicts their will upon the other side regardless of the laws, conventions, and norms of society; and without any limiting principle. "Rule of law for thee but not for me" is not rule of law, and has no moral legitimacy for the "thee" to respect or comply.

Indefinite Nature of the Suffering

The indefinite-ness of the situation is itself a source of considerable suffering, or a powerful amplification of the suffering one is already experiencing. It is infinitely easier and more bearable to handle suffering that you can see its end, when it will pass, versus suffering that seems inescapable and endless. (The feeling that the suffering is inescapable is a ubiquitous factor that leads people to commit suicide.)

C'mon, most of these are silly?

The ultimate refuge of someone trapped by the facts is scorn and mockery. Human nature drives a person to feel and act derisive about something that requires depth to grasp. Human nature also strongly tends towards not just denying but mocking anything that challenges the morality and prudence of your opinions and actions. Thus people are told that their experiences and suffering from mask mandates is not real and makes no sense – one of the most insidious and abhorrent forms of abusive manipulation.

It is very difficult to gain an appreciation and understanding of most of the things on this list. On the other hand, it is far easier to destroy any sense of comprehension and emotional awareness of these – all that is necessary is one pithy line scorning this whole notion as delusional. Such is the power of mockery, that one witty zinger can completely vanquish the awareness gained from many hours of thoughtfulness and introspection.

So no, these are not silly, and feeling these does not make you a baby. This accusation is nothing more than the panicked derision that is the last defense of someone who can't debate the actual facts.

The Manipulative Nature of an Abusive Relationship

One of the textbook tactics utilized by abusers to maintain control in an abusive relationship is to define the context and facts of anything related to the relationship so as to get in the victim's head so to speak and distort their sense of reality so that they are unable to articulate – even to themselves – the fact of their abuse and victimization.

As we all can see, the constant claims of “facemasks are not a big deal”, “there's no conceivable reason for anyone to think that masks can be harmful”, etc, accomplished this quite effectively. The goal of this article was to unwind this pernicious and abusive lie in order to re-empower victims of forced masking against the proponents of mask policies who are abusive and manipulative. (Sometimes mask policies are reluctantly put in place in order to accommodate political or legal realities where masking is the least destructive option.)

This can be summed up as one more type of emotional distress inflicted by mask mandate proponents:

The contention that “facemasks are just an inconvenience” amounts to abusive manipulation that steals the ability of the victims of forced masking to identify and articulate the suffering and harm they experience from forced mask wearing.

To conclude, the quote at the top of this article from DA Henderson – widely credited with the eradication of smallpox – is very revealing:

“Experience has shown that communities faced with epidemics or other adverse events respond best and with the least anxiety when the normal social functioning of the community is least disrupted”

It is hard to imagine a greater disruption to normal living than the highly visible and symbolic masks ubiquitously worn everywhere.

NOTICE FOR MANDATING COVID-19 MASKS

January 4, 2022

This serves as notice that the mandate for any individual to wear a mask against COVID-19 violates federal law. All COVID-19 masks, whether surgical, N95 or other respirators, are authorized, not approved or licensed, by the federal government; they are Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) only. They merely “may be effective.” Federal law states:

Title 21 U.S.C. § 360bbb-3(e)(1)(A)(ii)(I-III) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (FD&C Act) states:

individuals to whom the product is administered are informed—

- (I) that the Secretary has authorized the emergency use of the product;
- (II) of the significant known and potential benefits and risks of such use, and of the extent to which such benefits and risks are unknown; and
- (III) of the option to accept or refuse administration of the product, of the consequences, if any, of refusing administration of the product, and of the alternatives to the product that are available and of their benefits and risks.

EUA products are by definition experimental and thus require the right to refuse. Under the Nuremberg Code, the foundation of ethical medicine, no one may be coerced to participate in a medical experiment. Consent of the individual is “absolutely essential.” A federal court held that even the U.S. military could not mandate EUA vaccines to soldiers. *Doe #1 v. Rumsfeld*, 297 F.Supp.2d 119 (2003).

In a letter dated April 4, 2020, the Food and Drug Administration stated that authorized face masks must be labelled accurately and may not be labeled in a way that misrepresents the product’s intended use as “source control to help prevent the spread of SARS-CoV-2.” The letter specifies that the labeling “may not state or imply that the product is intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection or related uses or is for use such as infection prevention or reduction.” Any EUA mandate requiring individuals to wear face masks conflicts with Section 360bbb-3(e)(1)(A)(ii)(I-III), which provides that the person must be informed of the option to refuse to wear the device.

Liability for forced participation in a medical experiment, including possible injury, may be incalculable. You MUST respect and uphold the rights of individuals to refuse to wear EUA masks.

In conclusion, as stated, YOU have NO RIGHT(S) to require residents or visitors in Concord to wear a mask as a condition of patronage . YOU ARE BREAKING THE LAW !!!

Dear members of the Concord City Council,

Thank you for all you do to ensure that the city of Concord runs smoothly. Especially during times like these, it is difficult to be in the public eye and to have to make important decisions that will affect our community.

I appreciate your concern for keeping our community safe, but I would like to respectfully raise some concerns about the proposed mask ordinance which you will be voting on tomorrow evening.

I am sure that you have all researched face mask efficacy and safety over the past few years, but in the midst of all the headlines, studies, and buzz words, sometimes it is helpful to review the basics from a concise and reliable resource such as the following page from the FDA.

[FDA summary of different face coverings and the level of protection they provide](#)

In this summary, the FDA points out a couple of issues that I believe are very pertinent to the discussion of a population wide mask mandate.

First and foremost, the authors of this page acknowledge the unreliability to block small particles of many of the common masks that people use (cloth face coverings, gaiters, surgical masks etc)

"Face masks may or may not meet any fluid barrier or filtration efficiency levels"

"While a surgical mask may be effective in blocking splashes and large-particle droplets, a face mask, by design, it does not filter or block very small particles in the air that may be transmitted by coughs, sneezes, or certain medical procedures. Surgical masks also do not provide complete protection from germs and other contaminants because of the loose fit between the surface of the mask and your face."

The author also points out that these masks are meant to be disposed of in a very specific way to prevent their use from becoming another way for germs to be spread.

Even N95 masks which are best suited for preventing infection come with important warnings that many users may not be aware of, not least of which is a risk of cardiovascular strain.

"People with chronic respiratory, cardiac, or other medical conditions that make breathing difficult should check with their health care provider before using an N95 respirator because the N95 respirator can make it more difficult for the wearer to breathe."

These points are a reminder that while face masks seem like an easy way to do something to prevent the spread of the disease, they may not accomplish what they are proposed to, especially considering widespread improper use which is an inarguable aspect of this issue. A trip to the grocery store is sufficient to provide plenty of examples of the improper use of face coverings, even by the portion of the population that considers them useful and wears them without being mandated.

It is important also to remember the many people who experience lightheadedness, blurry vision, headaches, difficulty breathing, palpitations, skin lesions, and other conditions from wearing masks. For many people in the population, the long term effects of these issues day in and day out will cause them more stress and risk to their short term and long term health than a covid infection.

On top of these concerns, I think that a factor that is often left behind in this discussion is the social impact of widespread mask wearing. Covering the face prevents people from being able to share so many of the facial cues which are so essential for normal and healthy social interaction. Especially in light of the ways that face masks fail in efficacy, these other issues must not be ignored.

The number of cases caused by omicron is concerning to many people, but the use of the type of masks that the majority of the population utilizes on a daily basis (non-n95) especially with the improper use of these masks makes mask mandates an ineffective way of slowing the spread of covid. Though it may feel good to do something in light of rising cases, any measure taken should be one that has a reasonable hope of making a substantial improvement.

I appreciate you taking the time to peruse my concerns on this matter. I hope that you will take them into consideration when you go to vote on this measure.

Mayor and Councilors,

My husband and I are both fully vaccinated against Covid, having done so as soon as was possible back in the spring. My children are both too young to be vaccinated, at 2 and nearly 5. We also all had Covid back in November after my husband first contracted it at a local fundraising event. None of us came close to being hospitalized. It was like a flu for my husband, a bad head cold for me, and my two children were hardly even sick at all.

I ask that instead of tying any new mask mandate to the rate of community transmission, it be instead tied to a predetermined number related to hospital and/or ICU capacity.

The fact is, this virus is becoming endemic. We can no longer count on bringing this virus to a halt by limiting transmission. Most Concord residents are not at great risk because they are either young or vaccinated. Those that are at risk are more than welcome to protect themselves by staying home, getting vaccinated, and/or wearing N95

masks. I have had trouble finding this data for New Hampshire, but for other states, I have found that the average age of a vaccinated Covid death is right around the same as the life expectancy, suggesting that Covid is not taking years from the lives of those who have taken steps to prevent it. And children have shown to be at less risk than vaccinated adults. New Hampshire has only had one (incredibly tragic) pediatric Covid death so far, in line with other respiratory illnesses.

I am happy to do my part (and ask my children to do theirs) when it comes to helping keep our hospitals functioning and our healthcare heroes from becoming overwhelmed. This is a real and serious danger, one I encountered myself when talking to my healthcare provider last week about scheduling my gallbladder to be removed and realizing that the Concord Hospital Ambulatory Care Center had been shut down recently because of staffing issues and the surge in Covid hospitalizations.

However, I find it frankly outrageous to ask those of us who have done the right thing all along to further alter our lives with a mask mandate that will continue on when hospitals are no longer struggling. My kids have given up enough. They honestly don't even remember life the way it used to be anymore.

My daughter will turn 5 in March and we will get her vaccinated as soon as possible. If the hospitals are in better shape by then, I don't want her to have to wear a mask or do any of the other ridiculous things she's been put through after that. She has done enough! And I don't think she should have to do any more to protect people who are perfectly able to take precautions to protect themselves if they so choose.

For example, when this all started, my son was only six months old – too young to wear a mask. We didn't take him to indoor public places at all until he could wear a mask properly, except for medical appointments, when he stayed in a stroller with a rain cover on it until he was in the patient room with a masked provider.

Tying a mask mandate to community transmission instead of a hospital-related metric simply allows this virus, and the unvaccinated folks who have enabled its spread, to alter our lives for even longer, without good reason.

I also feel that continuing a mask mandate when it's not necessary will hurt our local small businesses. Folks will be uneasy about visiting restaurants and bars where they need to take their masks off if there is still a mask mandate, even if it's not one that's actually needed.

Dear members of the Concord City Council,

Thank you for all you do to ensure that the city of Concord runs smoothly. Especially during times like these, it is difficult to be in the public eye and to have to make important decisions that will affect our community.

I appreciate your concern for keeping our community safe, but I would like to respectfully raise some concerns about the proposed mask ordinance which you will be voting on tomorrow evening.

I am sure that you have all researched face mask efficacy and safety over the past few years, but in the midst of all the headlines, studies, and buzz words, sometimes it is helpful to review the basics from a concise and reliable resource such as the following page from the FDA.

[FDA summary of different face coverings and the level of protection they provide](#)

In this summary, the FDA points out a couple of issues that I believe are very pertinent to the discussion of a population wide mask mandate.

First and foremost, the authors of this page acknowledge the unreliability to block small particles of many of the common masks that people use (cloth face coverings, gaiters, surgical masks etc)
"Face masks may or may not meet any fluid barrier or filtration efficiency levels"

"While a surgical mask may be effective in blocking splashes and large-particle droplets, a face mask, by design, it does not filter or block very small particles in the air that may be transmitted by coughs, sneezes, or certain medical procedures. Surgical masks also do not provide complete protection from

germs and other contaminants because of the loose fit between the surface of the mask and your face."

The author also points out that these masks are meant to be disposed of in a very specific way to prevent their use from becoming another way for germs to be spread.

Even N95 masks which are best suited for preventing infection come with important warnings that many users may not be aware of, not least of which is a risk of cardiovascular strain.

"People with chronic respiratory, cardiac, or other medical conditions that make breathing difficult should check with their health care provider before using an N95 respirator because the N95 respirator can make it more difficult for the wearer to breathe."

These points are a reminder that while face masks seem like an easy way to do something to prevent the spread of the disease, they may not accomplish what they are proposed to, especially considering widespread improper use which is an inarguable aspect of this issue. A trip to the grocery store is sufficient to provide plenty of examples of the improper use of face coverings, even by the portion of the population that considers them useful and wears them without being mandated.

It is important also to remember the many people who experience lightheadedness, blurry vision, headaches, difficulty breathing, palpitations, skin lesions, and other conditions from wearing masks. For many people in the population, the long term effects of these issues day in and day out will cause them more stress and risk to their short term and long term health than a covid infection.

On top of these concerns, I think that a factor that is often left behind in this discussion is the social impact of widespread mask wearing. Covering the face prevents people from being able to share so many of the facial cues which are so essential for normal and healthy social interaction. Especially in light of the ways that face masks fail in efficacy, these other issues must not be ignored.

The number of cases caused by omicron is concerning to many people, but the use of the type of masks that the majority of the population utilizes on a daily basis (non-n95) especially with the improper use of these masks makes mask mandates an ineffective way of slowing the spread of covid. Though it may feel good to do something in light of rising cases, any measure taken should be one that has a reasonable hope of making a substantial improvement.

I appreciate you taking the time to peruse my concerns on this matter. I hope that you will take them into consideration when you go to vote on this measure.

Dear Mayor and Council,

This is not the Middle Ages. We don't summon the barber with his leeches when someone is sick. We don't accuse women of witchcraft.

Millions of lives have been saved by public health measures. Disease does spread, but much less than it would without public health measures, including required vaccinations, TB tests, child health screenings, etc.

What makes Covid-19 different? Nothing. The CDC and the state have emphasized the multilayer approach to reducing this pandemic disease - social distancing, masking, vaccination, and testing.

Mandates in public health are required because there are people who are uninformed, selfish, and lazy, and won't take basic steps absent a strong nudge. We live in a community, which requires thinking about our neighbors and making small sacrifices for them. There will always be people who do not pick up after their dogs. There will always be a few people who refuse to vaccinate their children. That doesn't stop a civilized society from passing health ordinances.

Covid is no different, except that some have alleged that it is a hoax, political, not a threat, or no worse than a cold. This is belied by full hospitals and a strained health care system, with non-Covid medical care postponed. This is a public health question, which has already been answered: social distancing, masks, vaccination, and testing are the answer. Masks are one measure which will help (both with source control as well as by protecting the wearer, including by keeping humid air in the airways during dry winter weather). Perfect? No. Just like the other measures, one more defense to help get R0 below 1.

Some businesses will ignore the ordinance, true. They will likely be patronized by "anti-maskers" and shunned by other customers (and employees). Other businesses will post the ordinance and help stop the spread. Their customers will generally comply and some will be very appreciative, as will some employees. You may recall that smoking used to be allowed everywhere. Society can adopt to intelligent choices.

The alternative is dialing the clock back several hundred years, before the concept of "public health" existed. Knowledgeable people will minimize their trips to Concord businesses. They may choose businesses to patronize in other cities and towns that have protective, science-informed policies. The pandemic will drag on even longer. It will take longer for our businesses to recover. More people will get sick. More people will die.

However, that isn't the end of it. There will be an erosion of public health ordinances as both a benefit and obligation of living in a community. Existing measures will be attacked, including vaccinations for children. Future public health emergencies will be worsened by the negative precedent of failing to pass a mask ordinance today. Count on it.

Mayor & Council:

I would like to voice my opposition to implementing a mask mandate on private businesses as described in the Concord Monitor of Sunday, January 9, 2022. I oppose the mandate for the following reasons.

- I do not believe it is the purpose or the right of local government to dictate to private business who they will or will not allow into their business. This is the responsibility of the business owner.
- About two years ago Covid-19 restrictions were focused on preventing people from severe illness and dying. Masking, stay-at-home, remote learning for students, social distancing, work-from-home, and other strategies were put in place and adhered to until vaccines were developed, distributed, and made widely available to anyone who wanted the single shot or two shots. Now boosters are available from some vaccine manufacturers as well as vaccines for five-year olds and up. President Biden has initiated an effort to make a push on therapeutics. Hopefully these will be widely available soon.
- Over the past year the focus has shifted to keeping people from contracting Covid-19, i.e. getting sick. People get sicknesses of all types on a regular basis. Over the weekend I have two news reports stating that about 65% of people showing up at emergency rooms, clinics, etc. don't even know they have Covid-19. They are asymptomatic.
- Government statistics are not adding together people who have had Covid-19 (natural immunity) and people who are fully vaccinated (medical immunity). When you add the two, plus all those who had Covid-19 but were asymptomatic, the total number of people who have some degree of immunity is probably close to 80% of the population of NH. At the beginning of the pandemic we were told that 80% was the level of immunity required to begin achieving "herd immunity". This has to be considered in your decision making.
- Many people are still wearing cloth masks which the CDC has stated is ineffectual for non-transmission of Covid-19. Are we going to mandate that everyone wear a paper mask, a N95 mask, or similar?
- I believe that the vast majority of people who want to get vaccines have done so. Convincing more people to do so is similar to gaining market share. Every additional point of market share is more

difficult and costly to achieve. People who are convinced that mRNA vaccines are not safe will not be convinced otherwise.

- I believe we are at the point where the pandemic has to run its course.
- I have received two doses of vaccine and the booster. We can't save those who do not want to take advantage of current Covid-19 technologies. Conversely, we should not further inconvenience those who have taken action to protect themselves. If someone doesn't want to wear a mask that is their choice, If the business owner does not want to allow them into their business that is up to the business, not the government.
- I further do not agree with the Council's consideration of tying the mask mandate to CDC measures. This is abdicating your responsibility. This matter, should it pass, should be voted on by the Council every 60-90 days taking into consideration local conditions.
- The focus on trying to protect everyone is unachievable. Chasing unobtainable goals creates frustration with people. When people get frustrated, they lose interest.





Common law. As distinguished from law created by the enactment of legislatures, the common law comprises the body of those principles and rules of action, relating to the government and security of persons and property, which derive their authority solely from usages and customs of immemorial antiquity, or from the judgments and decrees of the courts recognizing, affirming, and enforcing such usages and customs; and, in this sense, particularly the ancient unwritten law of England. The "common law" is all the statutory and case law background of England and the American colonies before the American revolution. People v. Rehman, 253 C.A.2d 119, 61 Cal.Rptr. 65, 85. "Common law" consists of those principles, usage and rules of action applicable to government and security of persons and property which do not rest for their authority upon any express and positive declaration of the will of the legislature.

Bishop v. U. S., D.C.Tex., 334 F.Supp. 415, 418. [This is an excerpt from definition and Highlight is for Emphasis]

Please take notice that the Legislature is bound by the common law and cannot block those rights secured by the common law at any time;

Common Right, Blacks Law 5th Edition:

Common right. Right derivative from common law. Right peculiar to certain people is not a common right.

Furthermore, government officials and their agents are bound by their sworn oath to uphold the New Hampshire Constitution (NH Constitution Part II, Article 84), the United States Constitution and the Declarations and Bills of Rights found in the Constitutions of the several states. These documents are the trust indentures which affirm and protect the natural common law-rights of the people. [See Constitutional provision below:]

New Hampshire Constitution, Part First, Article 2: Natural Rights

All men have certain natural, essential and inherent rights – among which are, the enjoying and defending life and liberty; acquiring, possessing, and protecting, property; and, in a word, of seeking and obtaining happiness. Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by this state on account of race, creed, color, sex or national origin. [Highlight added for emphasis]

Please take further notice that the People created government. Therefore, all powers granted came from the People. No government official, agent, or corporation created under the authority of the legislature has been granted authority over the liberty interests of the People.

Please take notice that there is no one in the state legislature giving the People rights. What the legislature creates as statutory rights, is simply for persons under their statutory scheme. The rights of the People, declared in all state constitutions, are foundational, of highest authority, and all government officials swear by oath to protect them as their primary duty.

Please take notice, if you are part of any federal Covid programs or receive any financial benefit to violate the liberty interests of the people, you are acting against the people with unclean hands;

Constitutional Right, Blacks Law 5th Edition: “Constitutional right. A right guaranteed to the citizens by the Constitution and so guaranteed as to prevent legislative interference therewith.

See also Constitutional freedom; Constitutional liberty or freedom; Constitutional protections.”

Please take notice that the rights you swore to protect are guaranteed, and your oath was to protect them and not interfere with them. Please take further notice that you not only have zero power over the liberty of freemen, but you cannot make executive branch orders or rules over those liberties. (Please see evidence below):

Miranda v. Arizona, 384 U.S. 436 (1966)

“Where rights secured by the Constitution are involved, there can be no rulemaking or legislation which would abrogate them.”

As New Hampshire is not a “home rule” state, no local government (nor government agents,) may enact legislation or ordinances which conflicts with those of the state. Since neither the General Court of New Hampshire (the legislature), the Superior Court (Supreme Court,) the Governor, the Attorney General, the Health Director, nor any other state office has the constitutional authority to mandate health choices, local officials are barred from mandating health choices.

I share a common belief in God's naturally created immune system and have vowed to not take any additional vaccinations or restrict the intake of oxygen into my body with a mask that goes against my conscience or creed. Therefore, government officials are prohibited from forcing or coercing participation in any of the requirements of your programs of any sort – especially, as stipulated in Dillon’s Rule, if those requirements are not in keeping with the laws of the State of New Hampshire.

Common law. Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by this state on account of race, creed, color, sex or national origin. [Highlight added for emphasis]

Please take further notice that the People created government. Therefore, all powers granted came from the People. No government official, agent, or corporation created under the authority of the legislature has been granted authority over the liberty interests of the People.

Please take notice that there is no one in the state legislature giving the People rights. What the legislature creates as statutory rights, is simply for persons under their statutory scheme. The rights of the People, declared in all state constitutions, are foundational, of highest authority, and all government officials swear by oath to protect them as their primary duty.

Please take notice, if you are part of any federal Covid programs or receive any financial benefit to violate the liberty interests of the people, you are acting against the people with unclean hands;

Constitutional Right, Blacks Law 5th Edition: “Constitutional right. A right guaranteed to the citizens by the Constitution and so guaranteed as to prevent legislative interference therewith. See also Constitutional freedom; Constitutional liberty or freedom; Constitutional protections.”

Please take notice that the rights you swore to protect are guaranteed, and your oath was to protect them and not interfere with them. If you have been delegated power in the constitution to attack them, it is my wish that you show where you were granted that power in any of the state or the federal constitutions, which guarantee a republican form of government to the people.

Elected servants in the state and entities granted licensure by the state were granted authority to manage their own affairs, not the private affairs of the People. No entity in this state has a charter that allows them authority over the private rights of the People. [See Constitutional provision below:]

New Hampshire Constitution, Part First, Article 8: Accountability of Magistrates and Officers; Public's Right to Know. All power residing originally in, and being derived from, the people, all the magistrates and officers of government are their substitutes and agents, and at all times accountable to them. Government, therefore, should be open, accessible, accountable and responsive.

Maine Constitution, Article 1, Section 2: Power Inherent in People

All power is inherent in the people; all free governments are founded in their authority and instituted for their benefit; they have therefore an unalienable and indefeasible right to institute government, and to alter, reform, or totally change the same, when their safety and happiness require it. [Highlight added for emphasis]

New Hampshire Constitution, Part First, Article 15: Right of Accused

No subject shall be arrested, imprisoned, despoiled, or deprived of his property, immunities, or privileges, put out of the protection of the law, exiled or deprived of his life, liberty, or estate, but by the judgment of his peers, or the law of the land.

Note that as one of the People, I am in the private realm and not part of any government office.

Please take further notice that no government official, agent, corporation, or business engaging in commerce has been granted authority over the People's private health determinations.

Arizona Constitution Text of Section 8: Right to Privacy.

"No person shall be disturbed in his private affairs, or his home invaded, without authority of law."

New Hampshire Constitution, Part First, Article 2-b: Right to Privacy

"An individual's right to live free from governmental intrusion in private or personal information is natural, essential, and inherent"

Please take notice that you swore to not interfere with the Private Affairs of the People, and you were simply given authority to deal with issues of the Public. Private family affairs were not authorized in the grant of authority to you by the Trust Indenture/Constitution, as seen below:

New Hampshire Constitution, Part First, Article 14: Legal Remedies to Be Free, Complete, and Prompt.

Every subject of this state is entitled to a certain remedy, by having recourse to the laws, for all injuries he may receive in his person, property, or character; to obtain right and justice freely, without being obliged to purchase it; completely, and without any denial; promptly, and without delay; conformably to the laws.

Please take notice that I understand that you do not have power to interfere with the Private matters, affairs, and things of the People in a Republic, and you do not have authority to vote away the People's rights, not even if all the Legislature came together and voted (See evidence below):

Kentucky Constitution Bill of Rights:

"Text of Section 2: Absolute and arbitrary power over the lives, liberty and property of freemen exists nowhere in a republic, not even in the largest majority."

Please take further notice that you not only have zero power over the liberty of freemen, but you cannot make executive

branch orders or rules over those liberties. (Please see evidence below):

Miranda v. Arizona, 384 U.S. 436 (1966)

“Where rights secured by the Constitution are involved, there can be no rulemaking or legislation which would abrogate them.”

As New Hampshire is not a “home rule” state, no local government (nor government agents,) may enact legislation or ordinances which conflicts with those of the state. Since neither the General Court of New Hampshire (the legislature), the Superior Court (Supreme Court,) the Governor, the Attorney General, the Health Director, nor any other state office has the constitutional authority to mandate health choices, local officials are barred from mandating health choices.

I share a common belief in God's naturally created immune system and have vowed to not take any additional vaccinations or restrict the intake of oxygen into my body with a mask that goes against my conscience or creed. Therefore, government officials are prohibited from forcing or coercing participation in any of the requirements of your programs of any sort – especially, as stipulated in Dillon's Rule, if those requirements are not in keeping with the laws of the State of New Hampshire.

If any town officer does choose to violate his/her oath by forcing unconstitutional mandates, they are subject to removal under N.H. R.S.A. 42:1: **“Oath Required.** – Every town officer shall make and subscribe the oath or declaration as prescribed by part 2, article 84 of the constitution of New Hampshire and any such person who violates said oath after taking the same shall be forthwith dismissed from the office involved.”

I assert that the governor and appropriate state authorities must immediately restrict or prohibit the actions of any elected body or official in this state participating in enforcement of any mask or vaccine order. The constitution gives this enforcement power to the governor's office:

New Hampshire Constitution, Part II, Article 41:

[Governor, Supreme Executive Magistrate.] The governor shall be responsible for the faithful execution of the laws. He may, by appropriate court action or proceeding brought in the name of the state, enforce compliance with any constitutional or legislative mandate, or restrain violation of any constitutional or legislative power, duty or right, by any officer, department or agency of the state. This authority shall not be construed to authorize any state action or proceedings against the legislative or judicial branches.

Please take further notice that knowledge of the law has been delivered, thereby removing qualifiable immunity. It can no longer be claimed an ignorance of the law or lack of intent to trespass against the law. In none of the 50 Constitutions or the United States Constitution did the People give power over their private matters to any government servant, nor does the government have authority in the Federal Constitution to offer anything other than government in republican form for all the states. All governments are without authority to interfere with any freedom or liberty stated and declared in any of the State Constitutions and I declare that any order requiring the people to obstruct their airways of necessary oxygen is unlawful. In addition, any type of government, police or military agent using any force or coercion, by themselves or with the cooperation of corporate entities, is unlawful.

It is my demand that my private rights and the rights and liberty interests of all Americans be protected. The people may not be denied access to any business, the ability to engage in commerce, or the ability to occupy public spaces based on unconstitutional mandates. Depriving the people of these and other liberties is a violation of your oath. **By not responding to me by sworn affidavit, showing where you believe you have the Constitutional Authority to force compliance with a mask mandate or ordinance, you agree to be personally bound for exercising authority not given in any constitution and violating Dillon's Rule.**

Please take notice that the People do not have a contract with your attorneys, who continue to instruct you that you may run over the People's rights, and then omit important parts of the law, so you may say that you had a good faith belief that all you did was acceptable. As one of the People, I believe it may be wise for you to learn the Constitutions that you swore to protect, and if you have not previously read them, you may wish to begin now. Please understand that it is you that swore and made an obligation to the People. If you should be found in trespass of your oath, your attorneys have absolutely no responsibility or

punishment for hiding the law or failing to teach you the law and the constitution. I do believe, with God as my witness, that you have seen things in this notice that you did not know existed previously. My question to you is: why?

Please take notice, all employers, businesses, and legislative body members, that as one of the People, I wish for you to know all the deception and ignorance of your attempts to remove the liberties of the People are without excuse. You now have the duty to research all these matters. Know that I, as one of the People, wish for complete access to the common law Grand Juries across America. I, as one of the People, wish to present your wrongs to the Grand Juries of the People, which belong to us, the People. The People are the masters of government and the time for correction is now. I send this notice in complete love and peace, and in the hope that these errors will be promptly corrected, so that we shall dwell in liberty, and you may stand honestly in your dealings with those you are hired or elected to serve.
