Mayor Champlin:

Thank you for asking me to serve on the Concord Economic Development Advisory Committee. I am honored by this appointment and believe that your interest in me may come from your long-term knowledge of both my association with the state's business community and your personal knowledge of my belief in this community.

As a long-time trade association leader, I have seen the inner workings of thousands of New Hampshire businesses, giving me a unique view into the risk, hard work and pure zeal it takes to own and operate a business.
