- iii. 169 Fisherville Rd Discussion, Motion, Vote

The Demolition Review Committee discussed all three properties at the same time.

Chair Jaques asked who owns the property.

Ms. Skinner stated as of October 1, 2024, Suffolk Village Development LLC is the owner of the properties.

Chair Jaques asked if there are four buildings being demolished?

Chair Spain drove by the properties and stated that they are deteriorated. Chair Spain felt comfortable with the demolition since the buildings are in bad shape.

Ms. Skinner stated there are four criteria to use when considering if the properties are potentially historically or architecturally significant, as follows:

- 1. The structure is associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of history; or
- 2. The structure is associated with the lives of significant persons; or
- 3. The structure embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or represents the work of a master, or possesses high artistic values, or

represents a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; or

4. The structure has yielded or may be likely to yield, information important in history or prehistory.

Vice-Chair Jaques moved to allow for demolition of the three structures since they are unaware of any historic or architectural significance. Dr. Tolles Jr. seconded. All in favor. The motion passed unanimously.
