Hello Mark:

I am writing to express my concerns regarding the issue of an interactive water feature (fountains) in front of the State House, as part of the Main Street Project. This has been brought up previously and now I understand it is being brought up again at an upcoming public hearing for the City Council. I will not be able to attend the public hearing but do want to express my concerns and state that I would like it to NOT be accepted.

During my stays in two other cities, I have seen these "flush style" fountains and have seen children, as well as adults, slip and fall where the concrete was slippery. At another location, where a textured surface was used, slipping wasn't an issue but I watched as two maintenance men were scrubbing vigorously, both with long-handled brushes and by hand, to remove a gross/dirty buildup of something, probably mold or something similar. The liability of both slipping and falling, as well as any potential health issues, isn't something that the City should be open to.

I should also point out that both of the fountains I've observed were in a park type area ... certainly not on a main street or in front of a State House plaza. I can't imagine the City wanting a lot of children, and even adults and/or our mentally disabled, running around through the fountains in the downtown area. Even if I were in favor of a fountain of this type, it makes no sense to have it in this main street area where business people are going to be going by. Assuming that there is going to be some run off that isn't recaptured, I don't believe people are going to appreciate having to walk through the moisture caused by blowing spray (during wind/breezes) or the moisture/run off.

My other concern is the water conservation issue. With parts of our country experiencing severe drought conditions, should we be wasting this precious commodity? I realize there are recirculating motors that help keep most (but not all) of the water; however, I wouldn't want that water on my skin just for health issues.

So, please consider my strong dissent regarding this issue. I do not wish to have my tax money used towards maintenance of something so frivolous and would, therefore, ask that you vote against the fountains.
