Subject: Traffic Committee Meeting October 21 Good Morning Ms. Hill and Mr. Bezanson,

I hope you are both doing well. We have spoken before regarding the problematic traffic situation on South Curtisville Road, as well as the dangerous 4 way stop intersection at So. Curtisville and Portsmouth St.

I was pleased to hear that Mr. Rapucci, principal of Broken Ground School, and Ms. Scarpati, principal of MillBrook School, as well as Matt Cashman, will be attending the next traffic committee meeting, which I believe is scheduled for Oct 21 at 9am. Please confirm that and let me know if the public may attend this meeting? Thank you.

The volume and speed of the Portsmouth St. traffic, as well as the failure of many drivers to actually stop at the stop signs, adds to the issues on South Curtisville Rd. There have been frequent near misses, involving both cars and pedestrians, when vehicles turn from Portsmouth St onto South Curtisville without even stopping or paying attention to the surroundings. The other serious issue involves drivers who pass traffic that is in line waiting for school drop offs and pick ups, thus creating a third lane that adds to the danger and congestion. Mr. Rapucci and Ms. Scarpati have notified parents about proper procedures.

Jeff Foote, from the city council, and Marco from the water department witnessed these safety issues when we gathered with neighbors recently, from 12:00 to 1:00 pm,, to discuss the pump station that will be built at that intersection. They both seemed astounded at the volume and speed of the traffic, as well as the frequent lack of attention to the stop signs. My husband and I, as well as many of our neighbors, would be very appreciative of any measures you can take to mitigate these situations.

I look forward to a reply regarding the meeting. Thank you very much for your consideration.
