Discussion:

This report is in compliance with the Beaver Meadow Golf Course Donation and Memorial Program Policy and Procedure approved by the City Manager on December 14, 2017.

Conclusion:

Page Belting has very generously donated a new bell on hole # twelve to acknowledge that it is safe for those on the tee box to tee off, as the players are now approaching the green. The previous bell originally donated by and in memory of the Holden Family had lost its iconic ring which the new bell has restored. The original granite post and engraving from the Holden family remains an integral part of the bell post assembly on this hole.

Page Belting also very generously donated a new LED monitor for scoring of golf outings, events and tournaments. This monitor will be on wheels and available to use in the clubhouse, on the patio and in the new tent, and will be a very nice addition to the golf outing/event customer experience.
