

# CITY OF CONCORD

*In the year of our Lord two thousand and fifteen*

**RESOLUTION** REPURPOSING SEVENTEEN THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY FIVE DOLLARS (\$17,275) FROM COMPLETED AND UNEXPENDED BREATHING APPARATUS REPLACEMENT PROJECT FUNDS (CIP#573) TO PARTIALLY FUND THE INSTALLATION OF AUTOMATIC SPRINKLER SYSTEMS IN THE CITY’S FOUR FIRE STATIONS (CIP#252).

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*The City of Concord resolves as follows:*

- WHEREAS,** the Concord Fire Department has received notification from the United States Federal Emergency Management Agency that its application for grant funding under the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program has been approved; and
- WHEREAS,** the Concord Fire Department intends to install automatic sprinkler systems in the Broadway, Central, Heights and Manor Fire Stations (CIP #252); and
- WHEREAS,** the grant award requires city matching funds in the amount of \$18,986; and
- WHEREAS,** unexpended funds from the Fire Department’s Breathing Apparatus Replacement Project (CIP #573) in the amount of \$17,275 have been identified to be repurposed and appropriated to partially meet the city matching funds requirement, with the balance of \$1,711 to be derived from approved FY16 operating accounts for facility repairs; and
- WHEREAS,** this appropriation is for a purpose not included in the FY2016 adopted budget, therefore, Section 37 of the City Charter requires two-thirds vote of the City Council; and

***NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Concord that:***

1. The sum of .....\$17,275  
be and is hereby appropriated as follows:

General Capital Fund  
Fire Department CIP #252 (Fire Station Improvements).....\$17,275

2. Revenue for this project is available as follows:

General Capital Fund  
CIP #573 Breathing Apparatus Replacement  
General GO Bonds (repurposed), 1/28/15 issue.....\$17,275

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3. Sums as appropriated shall be administered and expended under the direction of the City Manager.
4. The useful life of the project is expected to be in excess of (10) years.
5. This resolution shall take effect upon its passage.
