



## What is Community Power?

Community Power (CP) is a program that allows local towns, cities, and counties to obtain and provide electricity services for their residents and businesses, instead of Unitil or Eversource. Community power programs are a great option for communities that want more local control, cleaner energy options, and lower electricity rates than are offered by the default electricity provider. Concord has joined the Community Power Coalition of NH (CPCNH) who will administer the program.

## How would Community Power work in Concord?

In mid-August, you will receive notification from CPCNH about the program launching in October. If you are a Unitil or Eversource customer, this notification will give you the chance to opt out of the program, or opt for another energy offering. If you take no action/make no changes, you will automatically be enrolled in the default program, Granite Plus (see electricity rate chart for program comparisons).

If you already receive energy from a competitive electric supplier, the notification will give you the chance to opt in. If you do not opt in, you will remain on your competitive supply.

You will continue to receive one utility bill from Unitil/Eversource. The only part of your bill that is changing is the price under the "Supplier" section.

You may leave, join, or rejoin the program, or switch to a different energy offering, at any time, with no penalty.

Per RSA 53:E, CP programs are entirely self-funded, and do not use any tax dollars.

If you participate in Electric Assistance Program (EAP) discounts, this discount will continue with enrollment in CP.

If you participate in Budget Billing, your budget program may be reset. If your program is reset and you have an outstanding balance, it would become due; if you have an outstanding credit, you would receive that credit.
