Good morning —

I have heard from three constituents about high traffic speeds on Shawmut Street, particularly between the Exit 16 roundabout and the split near Oak Hill and Appleton Street, in both directions. I am told there was a fence taken hit by a car not making the curve coming down the hill (seeking to confirm in follow up calls); the speed limit there reduces to 15 mph but might need that sign moved farther up or with more fanfare.

The constituent requests vary from general traffic calming, to sidewalks on Shawmut and higher curbs on the sidewalk section between the old Eastman School down to the roundabout. As a first step, perhaps we can pull any crash data and capture speed data.
