Dear Jim,

I read this week that the City was considering discontinuing the truck-based leaf collection program. Don't do it!

I understand that the benefits of the current collection program may be uneven across the city, but the alternative is worse. I suspect that happy residents vastly outnumber the complainers (but of course you only hear the complaints!). I reside at 17 Rumford Street and have three of the largest trees in Merrimack County (honest...they are on the State's Big Tree registry) and several other mature trees. If I had to BAG all the leaves that fall in my yard, I would probably need 80 bags. Right now, I can use a blower to get my leaves to the curb, but if I had to bag all those leaves, it would take many additional hours of time; I would have to hire someone to help. So the overall expense of a bagged-leaf approach would be much higher than the direct cost to the city.
