**SUBJECT:** Revision to Ordinance and Non-Ordinance Based Fees, Fines, and Penalties

## **Recommendation**

Set for public hearing at the April City Council meeting the attached ordinance and non-ordinance based fees revising fees, fines, and penalties. Most proposed fee, fine, and penalty increases will be effective on July 1, 2019.

### **Background**

Annually each City department revises and recommends fee increases or changes based on inflation, market conditions and budget changes. While non-ordinance based fees do not require a public hearing, they are included within this process and report each year.

Departments continue with the more strategic approach to raising rates for fees and penalties. Both ordinance and non-ordinance based fee increase recommendations are for items that should be increased due to market conditions or other factors. All other items that are at market rate or not in need of an increase will remain at current levels.

#### **Conclusion**

The critical aspect of the process is to maintain responsible fees and charges that are adequate to support delivery of city services.
