# Chicken Keeping Rules

In Salem, you can keep chickens for personal use as long as you follow the city guidelines. No permit or license is needed. You must maintain your chicken facility in a condition that does not produce noise or odor that creates a nuisance for other properties.

## **Property types**

You can keep chickens at:

- A home
- Community garden
- School-owned property
- Property owned by a religious organization

Additional information submitted by Stacey Brown:

I have attached the city guidelines for another capital city that I would like to be included in consideration - Salem, Oregon is almost four times larger than Concord. Salem allows up to six chickens with the chicken coop and runway three feet away from another property on the lot and 25 feet from residences on neighboring lots. I would like Community Development and Code Administration to consider modifying the ordinance to outline distance from neighboring residences, if any, rather than property lines.

# How many chickens you can have

- A maximum of six hens per property
- Roosters are not allowed

You may keep up to six hens in Salem without a permit or license.

#### **Chicken facilities**

A "chicken facility" includes a coop and runway. A coop is a roofed shelter for chickens. A runway is a fully enclosed fenced area connected to the coop. The coop and runway create an indoor and outdoor environment for the chickens. Chickens must remain confined to the chicken facility.

#### Location of your chicken facility:

- In the rear yard
- At least three feet away from any other building on the property
- At least 25 feet away from a residence on an adjacent unit of land

You must comply with all zoning standards such as building setbacks and lot coverage limits.

#### Size of your chicken facility:

- At least six square feet of run space per chicken
- At least three square feet of coop space per chicken

A coop may not exceed 120 square feet.

()

Chicken coops must be at least three feet away from other buildings and comply with zoning standards.

## **Guideline exemptions**

You do not have to meet any guidelines if your property meets one of the following criteria:

- Zoned Residential Agriculture (RA) and the lot size is at least 10,000 square feet.
- Zoned Exclusive Farm Use (EFU), any size lot.
