Bicycle and Pedestrian Subcommittee of the Transportation Policy Advisory Committee

1. Minutes of the June 3, 2019 Meeting

Craig motioned to approve the minutes of the June 3 meeting, Ursula seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

3. Demonstration Project

Sam provided an update on his latest conversations with the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission (SNHPC) regarding borrowing demonstration materials. SNHPC has approved the project and the proposed date of October 2, 2019 and just wants to see that the project has been approved by City Council. Sam plans to submit a report to Council for the August meeting summarizing the project and requesting approval for the project.

The group discussed various outreach methods including contacting the Principals of Rundlett and Abbot-Downing Schools to see if the subcommittee could provide an informational flyer in the back-to-school emails. Other outreach efforts discussed included providing information to the City's Public Information Officer, talking with the PATCH and Concord Insider, and knocking on doors of houses directly abutting the bike lane as they may be impacted by the loss of parking for the day. A temporary event webpage hosted by CNHRPC was discussed as well. The group also discussed day-of logistics including volunteers, set up time, and any additional materials that may be needed.

4. I-93 Bow-Concord update

Craig and Sam provided an update from the public meeting held on Wednesday June 26^{th} at DOT. A big takeaway was that there were quite a few people that expressed that they were not convinced that the addition of another lane and an accessory lane would alleviate congestion problems.
